

## *Second Ascent*

and they shall trample upon the Holy City forty and two months.

And the beast which I saw was like unto a leopard,

and over the number of his name,

having the harps of God.  
in their hands.**

And the second *Angel* poured out His ampul upon the sea, and it became blood, as of a corpse;  
and every living soul in the sea died.

And He carried me away into the wilderness through the Spirit,  
and I saw a woman sitting upon a scarlet *colored* beast, full of blasphemous names, having seven heads and ten horns.

And the woman was arrayed in purple and scarlet, and adorned with gold and precious stones and pearls,  
holding a golden cup in her hand, full of abominations and the filthiness of her infidelity.

And there was a name written upon her forehead, a mystery:

for the marriage of the Lamb hath come, and His bride hath made herself ready.**

**And it was bestowed upon her to be arrayed in bright, pure fine linen.**

**For the fine linen is the righteousness of the Saints.**

And I saw Thrones, and those sitting upon them, and *the power of judgment* was granted unto them,
